3.3. District Governor's Official Visit to Clubs

As District Governor, I had visited all the clubs in the District, either individually or on Zone basis. I had also visited 5 clubs for 2nd time to attend to their problems.

3.4. Cabinet Meetings

The Cabinet was formed with 1 Cabinet Secretary, 1 Cabinet Treasurer, 8 Region Chairpersons, 20 Zone Chairpersons and 65 District Chairpersons, making a total of 95 officers. The District have 1 Past International Director, Council Chairperson, 4 Past Council Chairpersons, and 11 Past District Governors, most of them attended the Cabinet meetings to play an advisory role.

In the year 2006-07, the reporting and submission of MAP had improved. Clubs in the small towns had been quite regular in their submission. The number of projects and activities had increased tremendously. The Alpha clubs had done quite a number of school community services, which also included a substantial amount of fund raised. Further they had been following the guidelines set by LCI, emphasizing on environmental and Leos with children.

On the other hand, the reporting and submission of MAP from the Omega clubs was about 60%.

The application for the Leo Awards had been very encouraging and it was very competitive. The criteria set had been followed very closely. Certain Leo Clubs did not get the particular awards because of just one or two criteria being missed out. Some of the applications did not have the Leo Advisor or sponsoring Lions Club President's signature. Some were very brief, without any comments or remarks from the Leo Advisor. Some clubs that had been submitting their MAP very regularly did not submit the application at all because their Leo Advisors did not give them the forms.

5.1.6. Certified Leo Advisor Program

This is a training and updating seminar for Leo Advisors of all Clubs in the District. It was held on 16-17 September, 2006 at Hotel Singahsana, Petaling Jaya. 31 participants attended the Program but only 10 submitted their assignments. Only those who submitted the assignments will be considered as completed the Program and be called "Certified Leo Advisor".

5.1.7. 34th MD308 Leo Forum

The 34th MD 308 Leo Forum was held in Penang from 1st to 3rd June, 2007. A total of 375 Leo members, comprising 325 Alpha and 50 Omega Leos, attended the said Forum.

5.2. Lioness Clubs

There are 7 Lioness clubs in the District with a total Membership of 176 members as at 30th June, 2007. They assisted their sponsoring Lions Clubs in carrying out their projects and activities.

6. DISTRICT & CLUB ACTIVITIES

6.1. Cultural & Community Activities

6.1.1. Malaysia's Youth Caring for Malaysia's Elderly

This project aimed to inculcate respect and a caring attitude among our youth for the elderly.

Scheduled visits and activities by youth and secondary school students to local old folks homes were carried out by clubs in the District. It is hoped there will be continuity in the implementation of this project - to foster a caring attitude among our youth, in line with our nation's initiative towards a caring Malaysian Society.

6.2. International Understanding and Cooperation

6.2.1. District Twinning

The District Cabinet in its first meeting resolved to twin with District 380, Shenzhen, China. The grand District Twinning ceremony was held on November 6, 2006 in Penang where both District Governors, Lion Ng Kim Leng and Lion Wendy Sun representing District 308 B1 and 380 respectively, were present to sign the twinning agreement. The ceremony was witnessed by the International 1st Vice President Lion Mahendra Amarasuriya, PID Lion Dato' Douglas Lee, Council Chairperson Albert Tan, and two other PIDs from Thailand and Germany.

The return visit to Shenzhen, China was from 25th to 30th May 2007. DG Ng Kim Leng lead a team of over 40 members visited their Mega Charity Dinner and a sum of RMB20,000/= had been donated to their project of "Aids to Poor Students" fund.

6.3. International First Vice President's Visit

Immediately after the conclusion of the District Twinning Signing Ceremony, 1st Vice President of LCI, Lion Mahendra Amarasuriya, visited our District on November 7 – 8, 2006. He toured various places during his visit, such as Malaysia Lions Headquarters, KL Lions Renal Centre, Batu Caves, and the historic city of Melaka. To commemorate his visit, a plaque was signed in Lions Headquarters. A Fellowship Night was held in Sunway Pyramid Hotel to welcome him and a Nyonya Lunch was arranged in Melaka for him to experience the culture.

6.4. Lions Renal Centers

There are a total of 6 Renal Care Centers in operation, serving the local community. The below table showed the number of patients and machines.

6.5. Lions with PDRM

6.5.1. Memorandum of Understanding and Cooperation (MOU)

The Memorandum of Understanding and Cooperation made between Lions Clubs International District 308 B1 and B2 together with Polis DiRaja Malaysia (PDRM) had been renewed for the 3rd time. This MOU was first signed 15 years ago and being renewed once in every 5 years. The then Deputy Inspector General of Police, YDH Tan Sri Musa Dato' Hj Hassan, District 308 B1 Governor Ng Kim Leng, and District 308 B2 Governor Dato' Khoo Kay Huat had signed this renewed MOU at Berjaya Times Square Hotel & Convention Centre, Kuala Lumpur on July 23, 2006.

6.5.2. Projects under MOU with PDRM

A big number of clubs in District 308 B1 carried out joint projects with PDRM. Most projects were in relation with crime prevention and road safety.

6.6. Sight Conservation and Work with the Blind

6.6.1. Lions IOL Project

The proposed Lions IOL project, budgeted at RM100,000.00 for the fiscal year, is at the point of taking-off. Due to certain technical problems, this project has been delayed.

To ensure the success and smooth implementation, the expanded members of the committee includes PCC Dr. Chin YH, PDG Jason Kon, IPDG Alex Nah, VDG Candidate Dr. JP Kamalanathan, Ln Dr. Hooi ST (head ophthalmologist of JB General Hospital) and DC James Loo.

6.6.2. Lions RECYCLE for Sight

In conjunction with the Lions World Sight Day in October, a district-wide project on "Lions RECYCLE for Sight" was launched. Region 8 took the lead in launching this project by District Governor on October 14, 2006. During the event, a health talk entitled "Avoidable Blindness" was conducted after the launching of recycle project.

On October 28, 2006, 19 clubs in Region 3 & 4 also launched a large-scale "Lions RECYCLE for

Sight” at Majlis Perbandaran Petaling Jaya by District Governor. LC Kuantan and LC Triang Mandarin also joined in and launched the recycle project separately.

6.6.3. Sight screening and Sight Preservation related projects

Sight-screening projects were being focused by most clubs in the District. SightFirst van was available for the function of eye-sight test projects commencing in the 2nd half of the fiscal year. The two projects that created bigger impact in the local community were:

- LC of Seremban Centre had successfully organized an “Eyewear Charity 2006” with Focus Point on July 16, 2006. The YAM Tunku Ampuan of Negeri Sembilan, the guest of Honour, presented 300 pairs of eye glasses to needy students during the event.
- LC Tiram City in organized a “Walk for Sight” on August 6, 2006. They managed to raise about RM20,000.00 for CSFII project.

6.7. Leadership Development

6.7.1. Region & Zone Chairpersons School

The Region & Zone Chairpersons School was held on June 3 & 4, 2006 in the conference room of PDG Dato Alex Nah’s office. It was attended by all the 8 Region Chairpersons and 20 Zone Chairpersons together with Cabinet Secretary and Cabinet Treasurer. Cost of this school was sponsored by PDG Dato Alex and I wish to take this opportunity to record my sincere appreciation to Dato Alex.

6.7.2. School for Club Officers

The School for Club Officers was held on 22nd July, 2006, at Berjaya Times Square Hotel and Convention Centre, Kuala Lumpur. 4 classes were run concurrently namely:

- School for Club Presidents (English);
- School for Club Presidents (Mandarin);
- School for Club Secretaries and Treasurers;
- Essential ICT Skills Seminar.

The classes were well attended by 64 Club Presidents, 90 Club Secretaries and Treasurers.

6.7.3. Lions Leadership Institute 2006-2007 (English & Mandarin)

This is a 4-Day-3-Night leadership training session. It was held at Trolak Country Resort & Convention Centre, Trolak. It was well responded with 53 participants, divided into two classes, one conducted in English and the other in Mandarin. After the session, the participants were highly motivated and committed to serve the District with what they learnt.

6.7.4. MD MERL Seminar

This seminar was organized by District 308B1 for MD 308 with PDG Lillian Fan as Chairperson of the Organising Committee. Those chairpersons under the M.E.R.L.O.W. from District 308 B1

attending the seminar were being subsidized by the District.

6.7.5. Certified Leo Advisors Program

Realizing the big number of Leo Clubs in the District, a seminar for 'Certified Leo Advisors Program' was being organized, to prepare the various Leo Advisors of the Clubs in the District, to be more competent in their role as advisors to the Leo movements.

6.7.6. District Trainers Conference

The District Trainers Conference was held from 18-19, November, 2006 at Century Mahkota Hotel, Melaka. It was attended by 32 trainers. All of them demonstrated a high spirit of commitment to serve the District after the session.

6.7.7. Orientation & Leadership Seminars

Orientation sessions for general members and Leadership Seminars for Club leaders were being held at Zone/Regional basis. Emphasis had been stressed for Clubs in District to organize seminars of this nature.

6.8. Youth Development

6.8.1. Youth Outreach

The main activity carried out was the YES Camp. The camp was held on December 14-17, 2006 at Kem Bina Semangat Kuala Kubu Bahru. A total of 119 students participated and there was an equal mix of boys and girls. There were also about 30 participants from various homes who were fully sponsored by various Lions clubs. A total of 21 Lions members helped to organize and carry out the camp successfully. The staff went through about 5 months of meetings and training with weekend training in Kem Bina Semangat.

The programme comprised of outdoor exercises, indoor activities and discussion groups. The outdoor exercises involved abseiling, obstacle course, 12-foot wall-climbing and rafting. Some of the indoor activities are recognizing twelve keys to excellence, self-awareness exercises and a show put up by the students. The students totally enjoyed the outdoor activities, but when asked to name two things that they have learned in this camp and can be useful to them in the future, almost all of them mentioned something that they learned in the classroom. The following are some comments of what they learned.

- "Do my best in everything."
- "The importance of values and our character"
- "The 12 Keys to Excellence"
- "I learned not to gossip and to have a balance in everything I do."
- "Do not hate people, just forget them."
- "Learned how to carry out myself during a presentation."

6.8.2. Youth Exchange

For the second half-year of 2006-07, most of the jobs are for selection of the outbound exchangees and prepare them for leaving the country by end of 2007.

6.8.3. Peace Poster Contest

To spread the message of peace, Lions Clubs around the world organize Lions International Peace Poster Contest to encourage children ages 11 – 13 to artistically share their vision of peace with the worldwide community.

On November 12, 2006, District 308 B1 organized the District Peace Poster Judging Contest. A total of 108 entries had been collected from 86 clubs throughout the District. Five experienced artists had been invited as judges and selected a poster created by Ms Ellie Yong Sze Ching as the First Prize Winner. She was sponsored by Lions Club of KL Vision City. Her winning poster had then been submitted to Multiple District Judging on December 6, 2006 in Johor Bahru where she had been selected again to be the best. In January, 2007, we were being informed that International Judging had been held and that she was selected as one of the 23 Merit Winners among 350,000 children in the world! It was a great achievement and honour. Congratulations!

6.9. Convention / Forum

6.9.1. 45th MD 308 Lions Convention

The 45th MD 308 Lions Convention and the 9th District 308 B1 Lions Convention were held at Sunway Pyramid Convention Centre from 27th April 2007 to 1st May, 2007. A total of 578 delegates were registered.

6.9.2.2. 93 delegates attended the 45th Orient and South East Asia Lions Forum (OSEAL), Penang, hosted by MD 308, from 2nd to 6th November, 2006.

6.10. Lions with DBKL

Jointly, all Clubs in Kuala Lumpur had participated in the promotion of civic consciousness activities and also other projects in respect of beautification and cleanliness of the environment.

6.11. Environmental

6.11.1. Tree Planting Project

With the support from the Lion Clubs in Region 3 & 4, a total of 50 trees were planted at Taman Ara Damansara to honour the DG and PDGs. This project had been endorsed by MBPJ as a joint project between MBPJ and Lions. Hence, continuity of this project should be ensured.

6.12. Flood Disaster in Johor

The year 2006 ended with a devastating natural disaster in the state of Johor. The flood in Johor especially in Segamat had brought tremendous destruction to the town and destroyed life & property of many household. During the flood, thousands of residents including our Lions members were stranded and left without food and drinking water for more than 24 hours. Flood level in some area exceeded 10 feet and at one time, Segamat was totally cut off from the outside world as all major roads were not passable by any kind of vehicles.

6.12.1. Flood Relief in Segamat

Headed by District Governor Lion Ng Kim Leng, the Lions in Segamat responded immediately by setting up 2 relief centers in the Northern and Southern region of Segamat town. Boats were sent to rescue those people stranded in the flood, some were found on the rooftop and some were holding onto trees. We provided temporary shelter, food, drinks, medical treatments and all kinds of assistance to the flood victims. In the midst of our rescue effort, we received a call from the Segamat Hospital asking for blood to overcome the shortage of supply in the blood bank. Lions

responded immediately by holding an emergency blood donation campaign at the vicinity of the relief center and within two hours, we managed to get 40 bags of blood, the amount needed by the Hospital! Our actions have won the heart of Segamat people. Many flood victims and other NGOs praised the Lions for their care, efficiency, fast action and hard work. In the time of need such as this, Lions Clubs as the largest service organization in the world should respond to aid the victims as we have the advantage to utilize the networking and resources that is available to us. On behalf of the people in Segamat, I must thank all Lions from our Multiple District who have responded to our need by throwing in cash donation and relief items. Thank you very much!

6.12.2. Flood Relief in Kota Tinggi

Ten Lions Clubs in Region 8 of District 308 B1, namely Lions Clubs of JB Host, JB Tanjung Petrie, JB Metro, JB Mandarin, JB Taman Century, Johor Jaya, JB Taman Universiti, Kulai, Masai and Permas Jaya together with Lions Clubs from Kluang, Kuala Lumpur, and Singapore and some well-wishers contributed goods worth over RM10,000.00 to the flood victims of Kota Tinggi at about 9.00 am on January 20, 2007. Region Chairman Lion Kelvin Lee personally drove his lorry to deliver the goods to Kota Tinggi. The project was witnessed by District Governor Ng Kim Leng. A total of 65 Lions attended the above presentation of the goods to the flood victims. The entourage later proceeded to the affected area of Taman Kuso with some Leos from Omega Leo Clubs of Johor Bahru, friends from Singapore, members of the Fire Brigade and State Assembly to help clean up the surroundings and some houses. This 'Gotong Royong' lasted until 2.00 o'clock in the afternoon.

6.12.3. Flood Relief in Batu Pahat

Districts 308 A2 and 308 B1 had joint together to aid the flood victims of Parit Besar and Sri Medan, in the district of Batu Pahat, Johor on January 29, 2007. A total of 200 poor families were identified by the Lion members of Lions Club of Batu Pahat. Each family is given an electric rice cooker, an electric kettle and a 10kg bag of rice.

On February 4, 2007, another District project on flood relief was carried out at a local Chinese Primary School to the benefit of flood victims at Parit Sulong, Batu Pahat, Johor. A total of 131 poor families were identified by the Lion members of Lions Club of Batu Pahat and received an electric rice cooker, an electric kettle and a 10kg bag of rice.

6.12.4. Flood Relief in Yong Peng

On February 12, 2007, District 308 B1 carried out a flood relief project to aid the victims at Yong Peng, Johor. A total of 206 poor flood-affected families in Yong Peng were identified by the Lion members of Lions Club of Yong Peng and received an electric rice cooker, an electric kettle and a 10kg bag of rice.

6.12.5. "Help A Family" Joint Flood Relief with STAR Publication in 3 towns

We were approached by the STAR Publication to help disburse cash donation and goods collected from the public. Together, we had carried out three "Help A Family" joint projects in Kota Tinggi, Batu Pahat and Segamat.

On January 25, 2007, 300 poorest families from Kota Tinggi were identified with the help of Region 8 Lions Clubs and local chiefs. Each family received RM300 worth of goods such as electric kettle, electric rice cooker, gas cooker, gas, blanket, rice, dry noodles, oil, mosquito coils, etc.

On February 15, 2007, 450 families from Batu Pahat and another 450 families from Segamat were identified and selected with the help of Lions Clubs in Batu Pahat, Segamat and local chiefs. Each selected family received RM300 in the form of money order prepared by the Star Publication.
