Form A-1 provides information about the amount of funds donated by Lions Clubs and the number of donated to community service. The form features eight categories of Lions service. Each category includes a list of individual service projects. Club Secretaries place an “x” in the box that corresponds to a project implemented by their club within the

previous 12 months. Secretaries also indicate the number of volunteer hours and the amount of money donated (in local currency) by his or her club.

The deadline for submission to the District and Lions Clubs International is before 30th June 2005. Club Secretaries; please submit this form as soon as possible.

YOUTH PROGRAMS IMPORTANT DATES AND REMINDERS

May 15 – Leo Club Officers and Membership Reports Due (Leo-72)

The Leo-72 form, which is mailed to all Leo Club Advisors in April ;provides the Youth Programs Department with important contact information on each Leo club. Lions clubs that sponsor a Leo Club should have the Leo club advisor complete and submit this form.

June 1 – Leo of the Year Application Forms Due

Leos nominated for this award must demonstrate leadership, service, a contribution to the club, distinction outside the Leo Club Program and integrity. Nominations must have the single district or multiple district endorsement. Applications are available through district Leo Club Chairpersons or can be downloaded from the Web

August 15 – Leo Club Excellence Award Application Forms Due

Clubs nominated for this award must demonstrate

community service, successful fundraising, leadership skills and effective publicity. Nominations must be endorsed at the District level. Applications (LEO 105) are available through District Leo Club Chairpersons or can be downloaded from the Web.

New Share Success Through Service Banner Patch

Lions Clubs that sponsor a new or expanded youth activity during 2004-2005 can receive the new Share Success Through Service Banner Patch. The award is a component of President Kusiak's international program. Application forms were sent to all Lions Clubs in the 2004-2005 President/Secretary Kit mailing. The application form can also be completed and submitted online.
